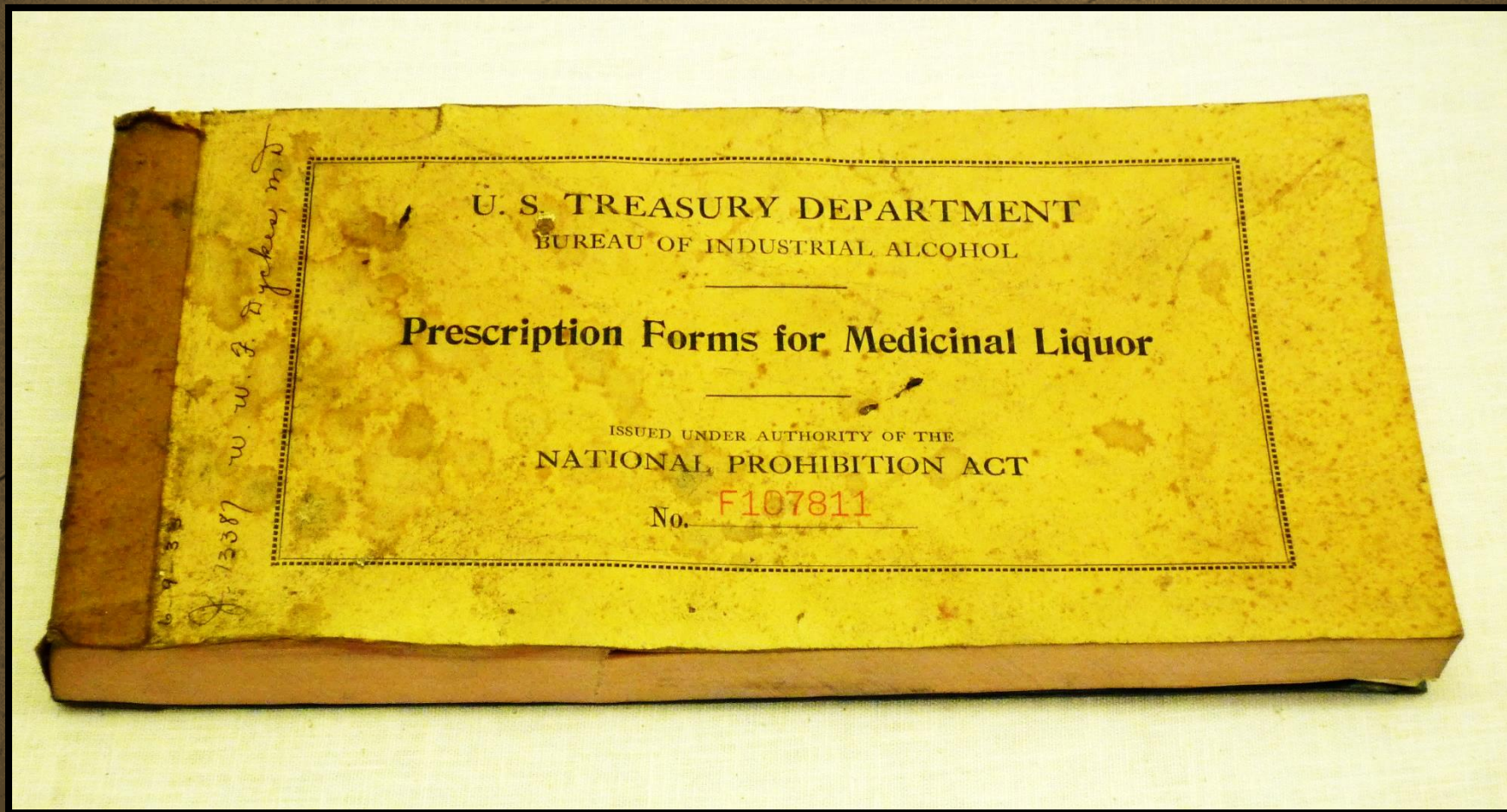

Because of forgeries and counterfeiting of prescription blanks in the east, the government has called in all the present blanks and will issue as substitutes a non-counterfeiting prescription. When the new blanks will be received by physicians is not known, although a few are already in, it is reported.

In this connection there were some disappointments. Doctors failed to arrive on schedule, leaving the Valley without medical aid for odd days; some doctors seemed rather unscrupulous in their charges. However, taking it all into consideration, as a whole the plan has been successful. Next year, if the idea is continued, we will be in a better position to pick and choose from the various doctors; keep a doctor in at all times, no schedule mixup, etc.
