

200,000 Were Allowed  
to Make 200 Gallons

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24.—Every prohibition permit granting the right of manufacturing 200 gallons of wine a year for home use was withdrawn today by the Treasury Department. Approximately 200,000 of the permits were in existence.

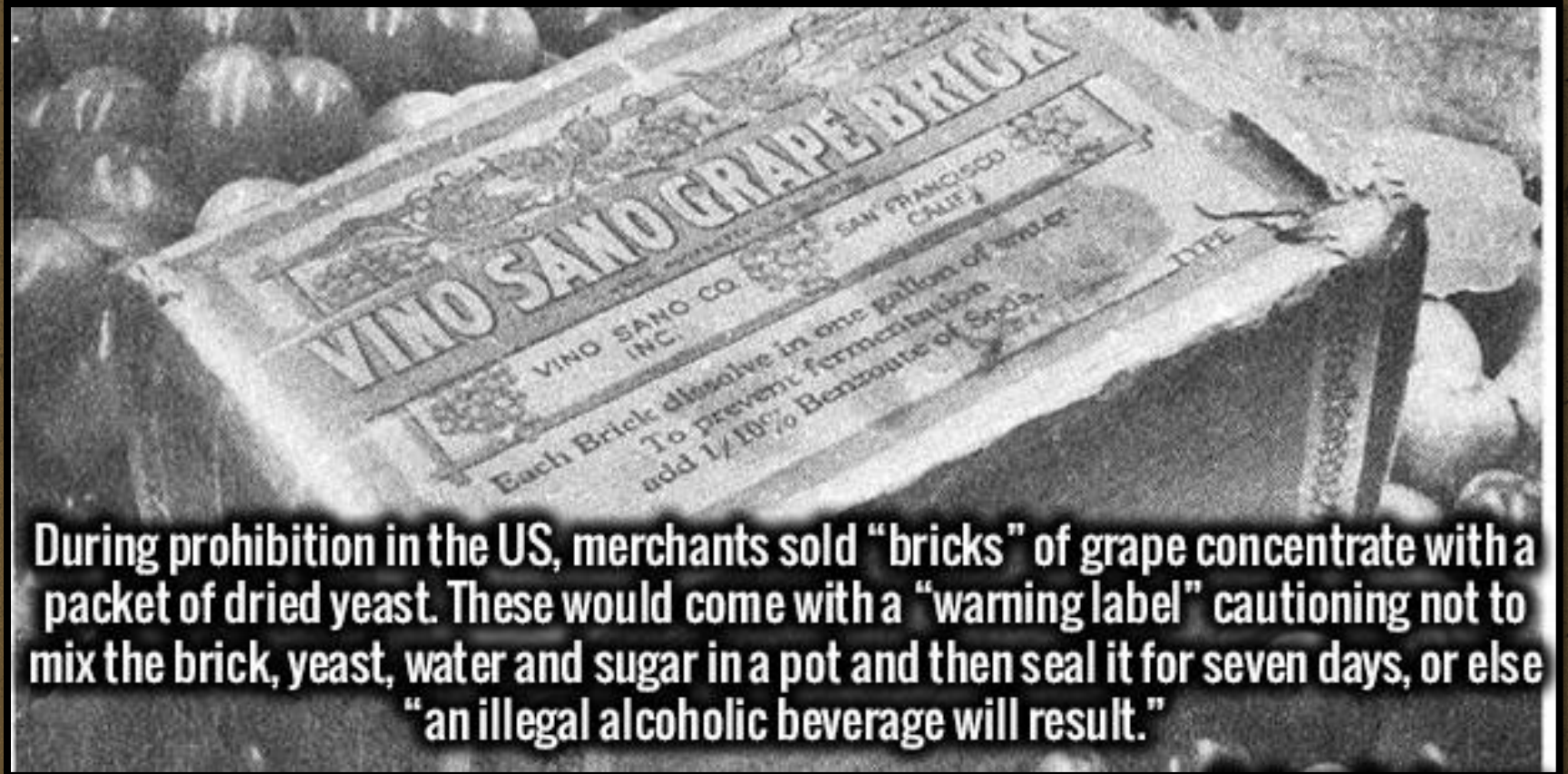
These permits gave authority for the manufacture of fruit juices, other than cider, without payment of tax or posting of a bond.

In issuing the regulation, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Andrews, in charge of prohibition enforcement, declared his belief that revocation of the privileges heretofore granted will check a large amount of wine from going into bootleg channels. The

**During prohibition in the US, merchants sold “bricks” of grape concentrate with a packet of dried yeast. These would come with a “warning label” cautioning not to mix the brick, yeast, water and sugar in a pot and then seal it for seven days, or else “an illegal alcoholic beverage will result.”**
